3. DELEGATIONS AND PRESENTATIONS

3.1 <u>Destination BC's Fraser Valley Destination Development Strategy - Advancing Experience the Fraser</u>

Allison Colthorp, Executive Director, Tourism Chilliwack provided a presentation, highlighting the following points:

- Alignment between Destination BC's Fraser Valley Destination Development Strategy and the FVRD Strategic Plan;
- The 2019 FVRD Outdoor Recreation Economic Impact Analysis and the outdoor recreation opportunities and challenges it has revealed;
- The Experience the Fraser Concept Plan, and Implementation Plan for local governments;
- Implementation of the Destination Development Strategy by the Fraser Valley Action Team; and,
- Collaborative efforts to outline the next phase of train development along the Coast to Canyon trail and seek funding to assist with trail infrastructure.

The Board commented on challenges to outdoor recreation such as parking nearby popular trails, asking how this was being addressed. Ms. Colthorp noted efforts made by Destination BC to offer other tourists experiences within the region and that these are being promoted through marketing strategies such as through social media platforms as well as other initiatives.

The Board raised concerns with respect to the size and scope of the project exceeding the Regional District's resources and the need for additional funding commitments from the Province and Metro Vancouver. Discussion ensued about developing a budget with the Implementation Plan to be submitted to the Province for consideration. The following motion resulted:
