Re: Annual Fraser Valley Regional District Capital Funding Request

The following table summarizes the \$37.3 million in capital investments that Fraser Health has approved for Fraser East in 2023/24. These facility projects and equipment are a top priority for the delivery of services in Fraser East. Fraser Health would like the Fraser Valley Regional Hospital District to consider contributing \$6.5 million (17.4 per cent) toward the cost of the investments as noted in the following table (\$2.5 million for major capital and \$4.1 million for minor capital).

Following is a description of the capital projects that are included in the above tables.

<u>Abbotsford ICM/RAAC/OAT Tenant Improvement</u>: Tenant improvement towards delivery of a new Intensive Case Management (ICM) team as well as long-term space solutions for two other programs, the Opioid Agonist Treatment (OAT) clinic and the Rapid Access Addiction Clinic (RAAC), which will all co-locate at the new site to support the Abbotsford/Mission area.

<u>Abbotsford Regional Hospital Drug Distribution Cabinets Replacement</u>: Replacing end of life Pyxis automated dispensing units (purchased 2008) that are not compatible with Windows 10, resulting in data security risks. The new units will introduce the latest technology and will allow for integration with the new Meditech Expanse program when implemented at the site. Associated renovations will include IT upgrades as well as a general upgrade to the space.

<u>Abbotsford Regional Hospital Land Improvement - Parking</u>: Development of a new parking lot for Abbotsford Regional Hospital (ARH) on the current land at 33012 Marshall Road to increase hospital site parking.

<u>Abbotsford Regional Hospital ED Zone 5 Security Upgrade</u>: The current physical design of the ARH Emergency Department Zone 5 presents risk of harm to staff from patients. The project deals with finding a solution to enhance staff security and minimize/eradicate violent incidents staff might encounter on the ARH ED Zone 5 Unit.

Abbotsford Regional Hospital Digital Screening Mammography Replacement: Replacing end of life unit (purchased 2008) experiencing frequent down time. The new unit will introduce the latest technology, improving image quality, diagnosis, patient comfort and ergonomics. Associated renovations will include HVAC and IT upgrades as well as a general upgrade to the room.

<u>Chilliwack Land Acquisition and Houses Demolition</u>: A land assembly of five lots on Mary and School streets adjacent to the Chilliwack General Hospital (CGH) was purchased in the prior year. An additional three lots were purchased in the same vicinity in the current year. This land is required to accommodate potential expansion of CGH and/or related health care facilities and services in the future. Some of the lots currently have residential housing units on-site that are no longer occupied and require demolition per City requirements.

<u>Chilliwack General Hospital Medical Device Reprocessing Cart Washer Replacement and Renovation</u>: Replace 12 year old cart washer that is technologically dated and does not meet current standards for thermal disinfection. The project will provide new instrument air and reverse osmosis water to support the operation of the equipment and department.

<u>Mission UPCC and PPH Tenant Improvement</u>: Tenant improvement towards the delivery of a new Urgent and Primary Care Centre (UPCC) and long-term space solution for the Population and Public Health (PPH) team supporting the Abbotsford/Mission area. The UPCC clinical service model will provide a mix of both urgent and scheduled full-scope primary care appointments. The PPH program provides services to promote health and wellness to patients and families.

Abbotsford Regional Hospital Ultrasound Replacement (2): Life expectancy of an ultrasound machine is six years. These machines are nine years old. There has been a 29 per cent increase in the number of ultrasound scans performed in the last five years. In 2016 ARH performed 15,790 scans, and are on track to perform more than 20,000 scans in 2023. New units are needed to keep up with the increased demand.

<u>Abbotsford Regional Hospital C-Arm Pacemaker Implant Program</u>: The mobile C-Arm, a medical imagining device, is needed for the new Implantable Cardiac Electrical Device (ICED) program being implemented at ARH. Currently the ICED program is available at only at Royal Columbian Hospital and Jim Pattison Outpatient Care and Surgery Centre. Service is needed for the Fraser Valley region.

Abbotsford Regional Hospital Radiographic Unit for ADC: The Radiographic Unit is used for Endoscopic Retrograde Cholangiopancreatography (ERCP), which is a procedure to diagnose and treat problems in the liver, gallbladder, bile ducts and pancreas. It combines medical imaging equipment and the use of an endoscope. This unit will assist the physician to see very small tubules and identify diseased tissues during the procedure, as it is very important to have a clear visual as the ducts are very small.

<u>Abbotsford Regional Hospital Breast Tomosynthesis Mammography Software Upgrade</u>: The 3D software Tomosynthesis is a software upgrade for the existing diagnostic mammography unit. This has been shown to improve accuracy and reduce both false positive and false negative rates. Continued 2D imaging risks include increased waitlists and unnecessary mammography, breast ultrasound and biopsy procedures for patients.

<u>Abbotsford Regional Hospital Blood Lab Transfusion Analyzer:</u> The current eight year old analyzers are the workhorses of the transfusion department and are due for replacement. The new analyzer will increase efficiency and productivity of the department. The analyzer will also serve the other sites with complex testing.

Abbotsford Regional Hospital Medical Device Reprocessing Low Temperature Sterilizer: The current sterilizers are beyond their useful life and will no longer be supported. The low temperature sterilizer is needed for sterilizing all heat-sensitive or moisture-intolerant surgical equipment and supplies such as telescopes, batteries, camera heads and some flexible scopes.

<u>Chilliwack General Hospital C Wing Air Handling Unit Replacement</u>: The CGH C Wing Air Handling Unit (AHU) is original from the 1950s and the unit is showing its age with rust, deteriorated parts and an inefficient motor. The new AHU will have a new fan wall unit with new coils, sheet metal with new insulation and damper with controls.

<u>Chilliwack General Hospital 120 Ton Chiller Replacement:</u> The current 120-ton chiller at CGH is old and currently too small for the current environmental conditions. The replacement will be larger with new pumps and controls. This would ensure adequate cooling in higher heat conditions.

<u>Chilliwack General Hospital C Wing #6, #7, & #8 Elevators Modernization</u>: Modernization of the elevators is required as they are operating past their useful lives. The #6 elevator was installed in 1939 with an upgrade in 1958. The #7 and #8 elevators were installed 1971. The elevators are utilized heavily and have failed several times recently, requiring patchwork fixes to continue operating.

<u>Chilliwack General Hospital Urology Table Replacement:</u> The current operating room table does not provide all features to perform best practice urology surgeries. Some surgeries have had to be cancelled. Urology services is a big part of the CGH operating room slate, with many in the region waiting for elective surgeries. The new table will provide more efficiently performed procedures and thus have the ability to increase patient volume for this service.

<u>Chilliwack General Hospital Parkholm Elevator #1 Modernization</u>: Modernization of the elevator is required as it is operating past its useful life (installed in 1972). It is the only elevator for the psychiatric department and is the only access to the second floor for the department, so it needs to maintain operation to minimize hospital disruption.

<u>Chilliwack General Hospital Mental Health and Substance Use Inpatient Unit Fence Installation</u>: The current fence is a safety concern as patients can easily exit out of the yard, and illicit substance are being passed back into the yard through the large openings. The new fence will have panels that fold inward at the top to prevent climbing. The Inpatient Unit Manager has met with Security and with Health and Safety to review and approve the plans.

<u>Chilliwack General Hospital Radiographic Unit Mobile Replacement</u>: The current machine is 21 years old and being used as a backup, as its technology is outdated. Replacement parts are increasingly difficult to obtain. The new Radiographic unit will improve efficiencies in the emergency, intensive care unit, in-patient units and post-anesthesia care unit.

Fraser Canyon Hospital Helipad Recommission: A fully functioning helipad is needed due to the unique location and complex patient transport logistics/risks associated with the Fraser Canyon Hospital site in Hope.

<u>Fraser Hope Lodge Roof Replacement:</u> The Fraser Lodge at Fraser Canyon Hospital was constructed in 1990. The roof has reached the end of its useful life and requires replacement. Leaks from the roof have been increasing especially during the winter storms.

<u>Heritage Village South and East Patio Roof Replacement:</u> The east patio is almost 30 years old and has exceeded its designed life cycle. On the south patio leaks have occurred. Water in the wall leaked behind the flashing and the membrane completely delaminating the SBS membrane, which is 30 years old.

<u>Mission Memorial Hospital Drug Distribution Cabinets Replacement</u>: Replacing end of life Pyxis automated dispensing units (purchased 2008) that are not compatible with Windows 10, resulting in data security risks. The new units

will introduce the latest technology and will allow for integration with the new Meditech Expanse program when implemented at the site. Associated renovations will include IT upgrades as well as a general upgrade to the space.

<u>Mission Memorial Hospital Acute Southwest Roof Replacement:</u> Replacement is needed for the thirty year old roof, which has exceeded its expected life. The roof is experiencing leaks and there are splits in the roof membrane caused by the heat and UV rays of the sun. The leaks have also cause internal damage to the building.

<u>Mission Memorial Hospital Exterior Wall Upgrade</u>: The wall water barrier is deteriorating and needs to be upgraded. The project will remove the existing stucco, remove building paper, install Tyvek commercial warp paper, install new strapping and install all new flashing to complete wall water proofing.

Mission Memorial Hospital Service Elevator Modernization: The elevator was installed in approximately 1965 and had some upgrades in the late 1970s. The controller is obsolete and working beyond its expected life. The elevator technician has been onsite frequently to trouble-shoot issues with the drives and other parts of the elevator. Modernization is needed to maintain consistent site operations.

<u>MSA Cottage Worthington Dishwasher Replacement</u>: The conveyor type dishwasher has exceeded its useful lifecycle expectation. It was not functional and the cost of repair was excessive. It is being replaced by a more modern, efficient energy recovery unit.

Equipment between \$5,000 and \$100,000: Appendix A provides a detailed listing of \$5.1 million in equipment purchases between \$5,000 and \$100,000 by site and item of equipment.

Thank you for your consideration of our funding request. I trust that this letter provides you with the information you need to proceed. Further to the current funding request, Fraser Health will work with the Regional District in strengthening the collaboration on planning for capital and digital health improvement projects in the region. I will work with you in creating a planning engagement roadmap. This will enhance the information sharing on annual capital plans and future priority investments.
