Subject: Automatic Vehicle Location Technology Policy

RECOMMENDATION

THAT the Fraser Valley Regional District Board abolish the Automatic Vehicle Location Technology Policy.

BACKGROUND

In 2008, staff brought forward an Automatic Vehicle Location Technology Policy ('AVL Policy') for the Board's consideration. The policy allowed for FVRD vehicles to be equipped with hardware which transmitted information to a central software application; enabling real time automatic location and performance monitoring.

At the November 25, 2008 Board meeting, the FVRD Board adopted the AVL Policy (copy attached).

DISCUSSION

The FVRD no longer uses AVL technology; it has been replaced with other methods of providing for staff's health and safety while working alone or in remote or isolated areas.

As part of a review of existing corporate policies, staff are recommending that the AVL Policy be abolished.

COST

There are no costs associated with this report.

CONCLUSION

In 2008, the FVRD Board adopted the Automatic Vehicle Location Technology Policy which allowed FVRD vehicles to be equipped with hardware enabling real time automatic location and performance monitoring. As this technology is no longer in use, staff are recommending that the policy be abolished.
