RECOMMENDATION

THAT the Fraser Valley Regional District Board give three readings and adoption to *Fraser Valley Regional District Bylaw Offence Notice Enforcement Amendment Bylaw No.1778, 2025.*

BACKGROUND

The Bylaw Offence Notice Enforcment Bylaw No. 1415, 2017 requires updating with respect to the adoption of the following regulatory bylaws:

- Fraser Valley Regional District Water Supply Systems Regulations, Fees and Charges Establishment Bylaw No. 1631, 2021.
- Fraser Valley Regional District Sewer Systems Regulations, Fees and Charges Establishment Bylaw No. 1768, 2025.

Additionally, the Fraser Valley Regional District Offence Notice Enforcement Amendment Bylaw No. 1778, 2025 will provide for updates to include provisions within the Electoral Area Water Conservation Regulations Bylaw No. 1387, 2016 so it more consistent with similar offences and penalty fees in other jurisdications.

DISCUSSION

The Fraser Valley Regional District Water Supply Systems Regulations, Fees and Charges
Establishment Bylaw No. 1631, 2021 standardizes the terms and conditions in which water
may be supplied and used for the twelve (12) community water supply systems owned and
operated by the Fraser Valley Regional District (FVRD). Adding this bylaw to the Bylaw Offence

- Notice Enforcement Bylaw will allow for the issuing of fines for contraventions to the water supply systems bylaw.
- 2. The Fraser Valley Regional District Sewer Systems Regulations, Fees and Charges Establishment Bylaw No.1768, 2025 provides for the terms and conditions in which the FVRD sewer systems may be operated. Adding this bylaw to the Bylaw Offence Notice Enforcment Bylaw will allow for the issuing of fines for sewer bylaw contraventions.
- 3. The Fraser Valley Regional District Offence Notice Enforcement Amendment Bylaw No. 1778, 2025 provides for the following changes to penalty amounts and compliance agreements for the Electoral Area Water Conservation Regulations Bylaw No. 1387, 2016:

- 4. Changes to Schedule E Designated Bylaw Enforcement Officer include the following:
- deleting Bylaw Enforcement Officers and adding Director of Engineering and Manager of
 Operations as the designated authority for bylaw enforcement for the Water Conservation
 Regulations. Delegating authority for bylaw enforcement to the Director of Engineering and
 the Manager of Operations would align with their familiarity and experience with regional
 priorities for water conservation measures
- adding Director of Engineering and Manager of Operations as the designated authority for bylaw enforcement for both the Sewer Systems Regulations and the Water Supply Systems Regulations.
