RECOMMENDATION

This report is being brought forward **for the Board's information** pertaining to the Annual Development Cost Charge Report and there is no staff recommendation.

BACKGROUND

Section 569 of the Local Government Act (LGA) requires that before June 30th of each year, the Regional District must prepare and consider a report on Development Cost Charges (DCC). The report must include:

- a) the amount of development cost charges received;
- b) the expenditures from the development cost charge reserve funds;
- c) the balance in the DCC reserve funds at the start and at the end of the applicable year; and d) any waivers and reductions.

DISCUSSION

DCC's represent amounts received from developers that are restricted for capital infrastructure expenditures required as a result of their development projects.

At December 31, 2024, the Fraser Valley Regional District had two (2) DCC Bylaws that require annual reporting to the Board. These are:

- 1) Bylaw 1074, 1992 West Popkum Storm Drainage
- 2) Bylaw 1096, 2011 Electoral Area D Integrated Water System

The balance at December 31, 2024 of DCC funds was \$567,178 (2023 \$536,979) and there were no waivers or reductions for the 2024 fiscal year. In accordance with Division 19, Section 569, the summary of transactions that occurred in 2024 are as follows:
