<u>Director Cassel</u> reported attendance at an event hosted by the Sasquatch Lions Club that resulted in distribution of bursaries to various community groups and students. <u>Director MacAhonic</u> reported ongoing efforts are being made to advocate for the residents of the Chilliwack River Valley who were affected by the 2021 Atmospheric River event. Director MacAhonic received a letter back from the Ministry regarding the unhoused situation out in Electoral Area E, and on June 22, Director MacAhonic will be speaking at the Goldcorp Centre for Performing Arts as part of a larger production on climate disaster stories. Director Machonic commented on her attendance at the recent FCM conference in Ottawa.

<u>Director Dixon</u> reported on the efforts of local goose management, as well as the start of another composting operation in the Columbia Valley and the owner's efforts to monitor compliance of the property. Director Dixon invited everyone to attend the Cultus Lake Fishing Derby on June 14, hosted by the local Lions Club.

<u>Director Waardenburg</u> reported attendance at the Tourism Harrison AGM, as well as the Kilby Historic Society's AGM.

<u>Director Johnson</u> reported on recent FireSmart efforts in her community, as well as attendance at the recent FCM conference in Ottawa.

<u>Director Davidson</u> thanked staff for their efforts improving the Sylvester Road Transfer Station, and shared that the compost drop-off has been closed recently due to a bear problem on site.
