Here at Park Street Manor, we are a non-profit organization that provides comfortable, independent living spaces for seniors. We do our best to provide them healthy meals and safe, clean homes where they not only live but thrive. This is a great service to the community for Hope residents including area B in these times where it can often be hard for seniors to find places like this to live.

All of our rooms have window or portable air conditioners and baseboard heating in them to keep our residents comfortable no matter the time of year. That being said, both of these systems are inefficient and are expensive to run. The quality of air conditioners these days is not great and they need to be replaced every once and a while. This can add extra cost to an already costly cooling system. As a non-profit, this can increase our costs, causing rents to be raised or funding needing to be found. Our project is to upgrade our heating and cooling system to EnerGuide efficient heat pumps.

We have been working with BC Hydro to have heat pumps installed in all of our rooms and dining area with an incentive from them which will pay for the bulk of this project. We have also had a very successful fundraiser where we raised \$15,000 towards this project. We are asking for \$5000 to help us pay for the rest of the cost. This will hopefully greatly reduce our electrical costs and keep our rents as affordable as possible for our residents. Also, these heat pumps will provide heating and cooling all year round so we will be comfortable. This project is going to be great for our community.
