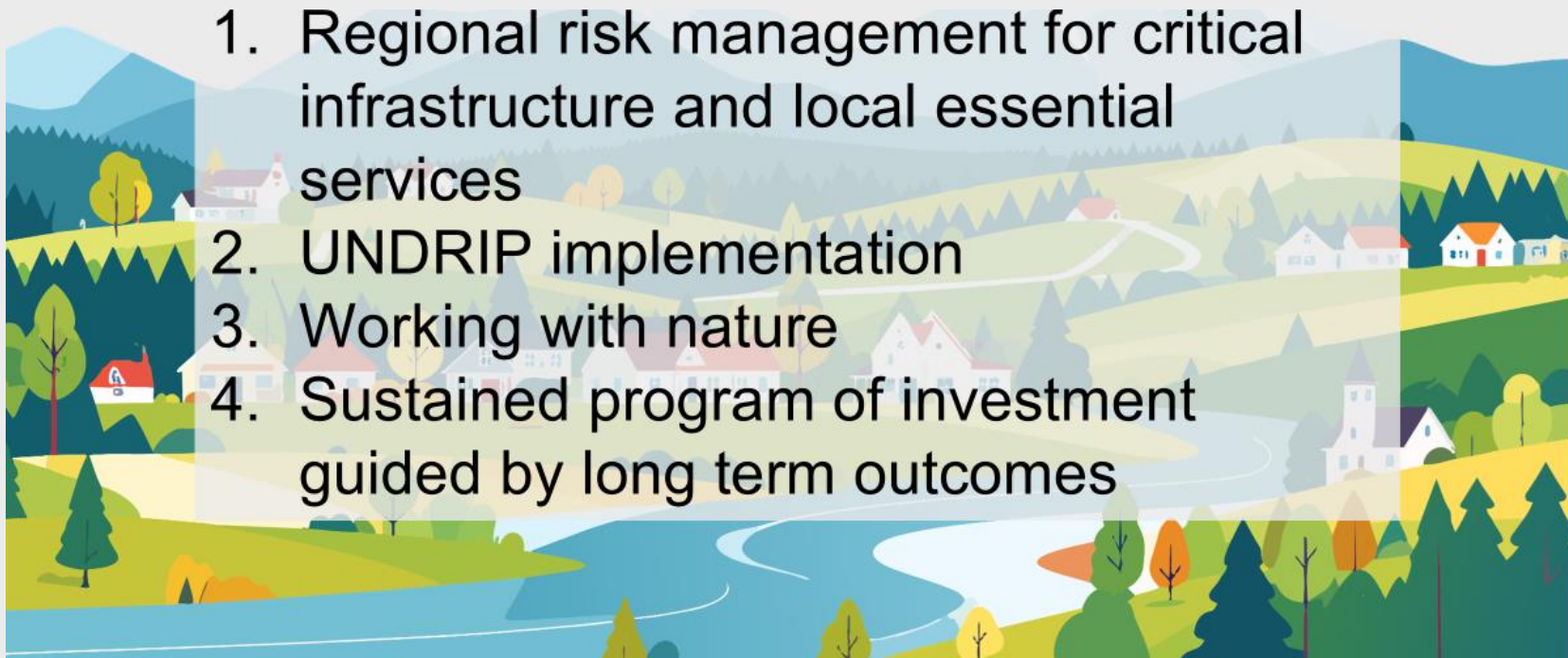
# 5 principles for working together:
